Positioning:	An elegant conservation building anchoring a modern Chinese restaurant with a pier featuring al fresco dining with breathtaking waterfront views.
Background:	<p>Clifford Pier, named after the former Governor of Singapore, Sir Hugh Charles Clifford, was opened in June 1933. Clifford Pier is a column-free structure in the Art Deco idiom, with ribbon-like arched trusses. Harking back to the red oil lanterns that used to hang from the piers to alert ships and rickshaw pullers, Clifford Pier was often referred to as Ang Teng Beh Tow.</p> <p>In the old days, Clifford Pier was the key landing point for immigrants and visitors arriving by ship, and still remains a key historic landmark till today.</p>
